Inclosed I send a statement of Dr. Kennedy's gifts to the Gray Herbarium. The first five of those recorded (from 1890 to 1894) are taken from the Treasurer's reports. They came in through Dr. Goodale and there was at that time no separate Visiting Committee for the Gray Herbarium. From a variety of circumstances I feel pretty sure that the "friend" and the "anonymous friend" mentioned in these reports during the early nineties was Dr. Kennedy. From 1896 to date the records are taken from our own accounts and I am sure of their accuracy as we have verified them with a great deal of care.

Dr. Kennedy has also been a liberal supporter of various botanical enterprises indirectly connected with the Gray Herbarium but not upon the same budget, as for instance some privately equipped botanical exploring expeditions, the publication of a checklist of the plants in Gray's Manual, the publications and herbarium of the New England Botanical Club, etc.
