Dear Mr. Deane:-

Referring to yours of March 27th
I would say that Carex brevior (C. festucacea var. brevior)
is a different plant than Carex Merritt-Fernaldii. It
is possible that your Shelburne plant named as the
variety merely represents a form of Carex Merritt-Fernaldii
with a congested head. My recollection is that I went
over all of the specimens of these two species at the Gray
Herbarium and wrote on each sheet my determination.

I am sorry to hear that you have had
such a time with the "Flu" but imagine that with the milder
weather you will be again up and around and as active as
ever.
