I had disposed of my specimens of *Botrychium simplex* from New Ashford so that none are left to send you. I enclose with this the results of collection upon Mt. Greylock Williamstown, which apparently include *B. lanceolatum* *B. simplex* and *Eaton's tenebrosus*? ^{no}

a questionable specimen which almost suggests *B. Linaria*. You can see a number of specimens in possession of Judge Churchill and party on their return, except that I think they have no specimens of *B. simplex*. The station of this species was peculiar as being in deep woods instead of pasture. All were from deep woods on lower slopes of Grey Lock.
