It is apparently a frellaca, but it closely resembles No tenera in Eatons Ferns of N. A., though I did not compare them entil the drawing was finished. There leaves of mind are not Shouldered, but Simply threecornered, or spear-head shaped.

I have not the book - Ferns of N. N., but only a plate, XLIII, that Prof Eaton sent me, so I do not know the description of No. tenera, but the drawing of find bears an astonishing tikeness to Lio plate of N. tenera. The only noticeable difference is that the primae in mine are Exactly opposite, while his tenera are not exactly oppoint. yours trus W. S. Wright
