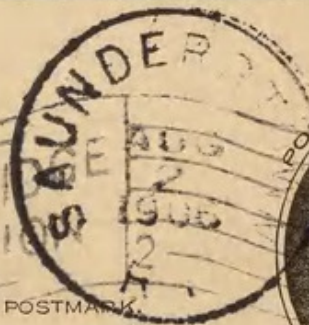
Samuelstown - R.I. Aug 2^d 1906
