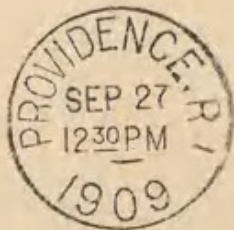


I suppose those poor self-deluded mortals at
