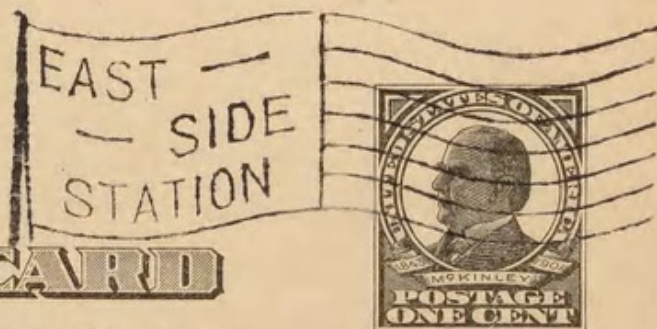
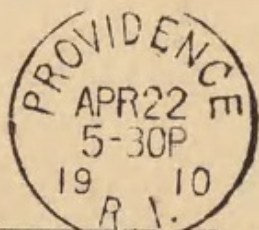


My dear Deane, Providence - Apr 22, 1910
