Dear Walter

I left out a card - here

the one to Peterborough - I have never
satisfied myself on the *ternatum*
group - and the *obliquum* group
of *Botrychium* - not only am I
not "dead sure" - but I am much
confused - and some groups of the
small species are likewise confusing -
they seem to "blend" one into another - in
a very disconcerting manner.

Eleocharis tenuis - which you refer
to as finding it in the "Desert" at
Peterborough - I find I have collected
but once - & that in Greenfield Mass.
in 1910. *Smilacina trifolia* - I have
from Pleasant Ridge - Somerset Co. - Me. in 1906

and which I remember perfectly well
collecting *Maryanthes* several years
ago - I think it was in Fort Kent, Me -

My plants have gone astray

Calopogon I find occasionally -
and I'd likely miss it - well I find
two other orchids viz: *Habenaria*

ciliaris and *Calypso* - I'd go
several miles (!) to get either one -

I have a possibility for the first -
for this season - which I hope to
follow up -

at our Port

I shall at the office
tomorrow am.
