I don't think we have yet got to the bottom of the matter of Asplenium pictum. I did not know that you had a blue-print of one of Davenport's ~~plants~~ specimens of A. ebenum, var. Hortoniae. So, when Mr. Weatherby found the thing at Somers, Conn., and we brought it home and photographed the living plant, I sent you a copy of the photograph (under the modern name of the plant, A. platyneuron var. incisum). It is that which is lost. You don't need it, having Davenport's blue-print; but if you want it, it will give Mr. Weatherby and me much pleasure to replace it.

The Woodcock scopulorum will go to you
bright or tomorrow.
