Lansing, Mich, Jan. 21, 1853-My Dear Deane- We armied here at noon, Enjour plenty and weather cold. Mr. Smith and man were found Jan. 9th and were buried There, their bodies not being in condition to bring home. 3 of the horses were found alive although the harnesses were nearly eaten off by wolves. A Feller account from the brother Tay Lays that he did not freeze his feet in first finding a ranch, but ofter finding it he started alone in search of the party. He wan-dered about for a day or two being lost and dug a hale in a know drift and laid mit all night, freezing his feet austers and face. He's coming out alught. My Mannis Cat. has 1990 plant marked.
