I can send you, and possibly among my
duplicates some from Spot Pd.

Would it not be well to ask Dr. Swan
about that *Lemna trisulca* & *C. hetero-
phylla* he reported?

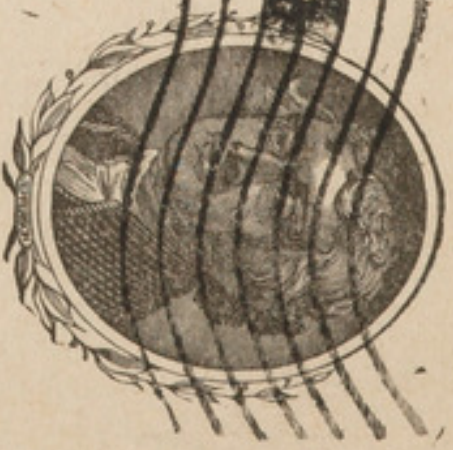
