As to the Oaks specimens of W.N.T. Morris I believe I shall decline becoming a purchaser, they seem to have fixed upon them a price much beyond what they would

be worth to me — Oaks supplied me
very liberally with what not collected —
birds there nots are not my wish in species —

His executors has written me on the subject
I have not replied to him, simply because I
am unable to decipher his name so illegibly
is it written — say so to him if he alludes to it —

proper place — I send 3 plates only —
either Proutie can engrave them or you
can have it done in Boston on Stone
or Copper but in the very best style
which ever ^{way} you may select & I will pay
part or all the expenses of the Engraving and
printing as the Society may wish — I
should like to see the paper cut as soon
as it can conveniently be done, that I may
secure my species — I am glad you
have instructed Wright to collect maps for
me I will very willingly bear my share
of the expense — There or four gold
diggers have agreed to bring me California
Maps — I rely on them however but little —
I am sorry to see the Hooker's Journal cut
down to — some of my numbers are waiting
about which I'll write another time — Our
