

was to put at the place where the

was Pleuroscopi - particularly *Hypnum* -
which is the feature of the Brooks.

The whole thing has been done
Crow-pitch fashion beginning at
the plates, backing through *Hept.*
Pleuroscopi down to *Asclepias*.

There is one pleasant prospect
connected ^{with} it, and that is, that
I shall back out of the whole of
it in 4 or 5 days more - For
I am very tired, and that is the
reason I struck out indefatigable
in your preface, which in all other
respects is my good - I made an
other error, which is explained
on 4th page of this letter.

The comparison of our *Murex* with

with that of Europe would Eu
almost 19/20ths of our species - If
it is necessary to indicate it (which I
do not ^{think it necessary} in an elementary concern of
this kind) better do it in the preface.

It appears to me you are going
to have an unnecessarily large number
of copies (250) struck off for me -
I should prefer $\frac{1}{2}$ would be sufficient.

I will note you in a day or
two about the advertisement for *Lesquereux*.
