

or 40 sets. By incorporating Wright's last collection with them the sets would run up to or over 200 species.

Each set would bring \$20. Wright to have 5 sets (= \$100) without further expense to him. — The title would be something like this, "Musæ Subspecies Americanae or Specimens of Mysps collected in Venezuela by Gould & in Cuba by Wright, named & described by W.S.S. etc" — The collector & locality to be noticed on each label. —

The above would I think be a fair arrangement all round. —

Convey Wright about it.

My dear Friend

Ten dollars is enough or at least as much as can be expected for a copy of U.S. Ex. Mus. It is only occasionally a purchaser can be found for such works.

As for Wright's Mus. Cat. they should not be sold for a cent less than \$13 a set — that is about 10 cents a specimen, just what I paid for Hooker & Wilson's Diannaeidae, western Mysps. Any body who won't pay that for them (if he is able) should not have them. — Miller Schenck & Miller should have them, but I doubt if they supply themselves in

this time by purchases. If some
of the sets could be lodged in the
large European Herbaria where they
could be acceptable it would be well.

Wright's last collection would have
run the number of species to 150 or 160,
but they would not have been all Cuban,
for I find upon second examination, that
some of the best things are from Valparaiso
(Has Wright been collecting there?).

It is entirely out of the question now
to get them in as a supplement to the 19 sets
- It takes a great deal more time &
labour to get a collection of myrs, particularly
foreign, into proper shape than you have
any idea of - evry thing has to pop again
& again under the microscope. Besides
the leaves are rare in hand & must
be got off before any thing else is

attended to.

I would suggest the following
disposition of Wright's last collection.

Two or three years ago I bought
of Fendler (for \$100, with which he was
highly satisfied) his entire collection
of Venezuelan Myrs & Hepaticae - my
fine & very extensive - 10 or 12 large bundles.

The Hepaticae I presented to
Gottsche. The Myrs I have given
to my draughtsman Schraiber who
is now at work on them (and it will
be a good year's work) putting them up
into sets, which after I have named
& determined them, he will sell for
his own benefit. The Fendler Venezue-
lan collection will make about 170
species. The materials will make 30
