I have not been able to attend to the Austin labels until today - been a little unwell but am now better in Cuna?

The labels will stand a poor chance of getting out from among the types, the way we are going on.

I have now concluded after consulting to send all the proofs to Austin with request to make his final corrections and send to you, upon receipt of which I wish you to have them

put straight through, and
let us finish the job.

I shall not again be caught,
or get you, into such another
scrape "you bet". — He had
no business to begin the print-
ing before getting his Ms.
ready & knowing what he
wanted to print.

After all the labels, bating
numerous little inaccuracies
and irregularities, will do
very well. No essential or
important errors now rem-
ain. The work too will do
him credit and be a nice
addition to our *Pragm.*^a
