

Cambridge, Mass. - July 17. 1872

To Capt. Wilkes, U. S. A.

My Dear Sir

In proceeding to work up the Botany of the Exploring Expedition for the winter. I experienced great difficulty from the want of all information taken from the living plants, such as notes about their size, part, & mode of growth, &c of the color of flowers, and other points seldom to be ascertained from the dried specimens themselves, and also the particular stations of the plants; the labels attached to the specimens or bundles usually giving only the name of the Island or district where they were gathered.

On application to Dr. Pickering I found that he had kept, with Mr. Breckinridge's aid, a pretty full, and to us invaluable record, of these very points, as respects the botanical collection in almost all of the places visited (after Madeira, Cape Verde Islands, & Brazil); and he

Kindly lend me the several Miss. volumes  
containing them among other more voluminous  
records.

To these Miss. volumes could not long be  
spared by Dr. Pickering. I had no other  
course but to cause the botanical notes, lists,  
and monographs requisite to me, to be ~~the~~  
transcribed by an amanuensis. The greater  
part of this copying has already been done;  
and I shall have to pay for it about twenty  
dollars.

I would respectfully solicit your permission  
to forward the bill of the copyist, approved  
by me, for payment by the Library Committee.

I wished to have laid this Miss. before you  
when you called here, yesterday; but I was  
prevented by my unavoidable absence at the  
time you happened to call. I can send  
this Miss. to Washington, ~~for expenses~~, or by  
mail, under cover to Mr. Pearce, if you
