On looking at the character of *Hesperomeles* they agree pretty well with our plant. Have you any of the genera in your herbarium? I have been examining my old sets of *Euphorbiaceae* with a good deal of interest. You have a *Lachnostachys* - a plant of an allied genus in Wright's last coll. - which Gray & the others did not get - of this there were two not in Wright - or at least in my set of his plants. Has any one been poking into Euph. since Knobell? Can you identify Schlecht's new *Euphorbiae*? Can that *Nuziumea* be *M. spathulata*? I have a great deal to talk about when we meet - of some quiddities to discuss - I am all alone - for I scarcely see Hastings - he is so little at home - much the same
