Many thanks for the copy of H. Indica.
It is a capital work - choice introduction!
I have not yet had time to examine it
much - but shall do so as soon
as the Whipple Report is out of my hands.
There are some papers for you to see - which
I shall send on by mail - Whipple has
sent me the plan of the Bot. portion of his
Rep. I. Bot. charac. of the Country passed
over - by Whipple. II. Description of the
more important forest trees - by the same.
III Cactaceae by Engelm. with many
figures - ~~and~~ to be cut - I think, a wood
They are not elaborately finished - done by
E. L. himself. He has a chart of Geog. dis-
tribution of the ~~species~~ ^{specie}. Whipple thinks
not a mistake fig. showing the habit of
each, might be introduced. . .

Let Purdie by his hand at restorung
one of Sprague's Spec. drawings - & resave
S. for new figures - The Rest of Spec
is not printed ^(in 4-to) as I told you in one of
my letters. It is Bechstein's, of which
he extra copies of the new edition of his
Report.

Did you send those Lorautes to Engelman?
He will know them at a glance - having
worked so much on the family.

There is nothing about the denotations of
Cladaria in Neopeltagon. — I have just
looked into his "Neosylva" - where he says
the name means "brittle branches"

Mr. Stone called when I was out &
I did not return. I should have been glad to
show him attention - if it were only for
your sake -

I told Riocreux not to draw the
Aphanochaeete - so let Sprague go on
with it. & any other new one that
you think will be worth figuring

I do not mean to intimate that
my name for the *Stomocarpus* must
stand - on the contrary, I saw that
Benthicus must be adopted - my *S.
odontata* being no species at all -
I have told the story in Whipple's Rep.
