Compositae which you can probably  
identify & they had better be  
described at once.

By the way - have you more than  
one specm. of *Rubia pippins* (A. Whipple)? I  
have one in my herbarium.

I received letters from Maggie this  
morning, dated June 17. She expects  
to join Mr. Roberts' party in a day or two  
- of course is probably now in England. We  
look for about the end of August

Dear Doctor -

Your gardener called when I  
could not write - & I should have

Thunber sends you a parcel of  
plants a day. I get them through  
the Custom House at the time I pass  
via Ft. Brasil. The latter cost  
nothing - not even for a permit.  
They are very polite & one even  
told me that I am an officer of Govt.

for money. Several persons in  
Washington have tried to get them  
for me without success.

I see that Eaton has come out in  
the last Lill. down. with some new  
California ferns. I told him that  
one of them was certainly *Pteris audrome-*  
*daphne* of Bot. Beechey - though it might  
not be of that. The plant is quite  
variable. & I hardly think there are two  
species confounded. As to that *Cyrtopteris*  
I saw directly after E. left that the  
fern was only a form of *Cyrtopteris*  
*fragilis* - & indeed had marked it  
so at a previous examination - but  
had forgotten the circumstance.  
Tell me how many plants I may ex-  
pect Sprague to do for Whipple - &  
how many for Emory. You had better  
let him at work on *Holocaulus*,  
*Peltaria* & *Thunbergia*.



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
