1860.

My dear friend -

Your letter of the 12th was received this morning, & the parcel was received two days ago. The plants were very acceptable. - You know those weedy things were my pet. Always think of me when you have duplicates of such-like.

I like Chapman's Book. It is much better than I expected it would be. He worked under great disadvantages - for want of books & collections. You must have helped him greatly. The setting up is excellent -

I knew you were working
hard - Pray try & arrange your
affairs so as not to be pressed
beyond measure. Don't be tempt-
ed to take new jobs till the
old ones are well disposed of.
It is not right to fill our minds
so completely with these matters as
to leave scarcely any room for
better thoughts. .

The printer has sent no proof
sheet yet of Impl. Exp. Prose.

I wrote to Stuart on the subject
- & he seemed surprised - & promised
to urge on the work. - As soon
as you can get the time I hope
you will finish off the Corporation

& get them off your mind.
Glad I am that your catarrh
has bid you good bye. - You
don't tell me about Jane. I
hope she is growing stronger. You
must let me know, also, how Mr.
Loring is - & present to him
my kind regards.

What do you say about those
plants of Dr. Hagi? There is a
large box of them at the Agray
Office. Do you know who will
purchase them?

We have gone to the country at
last. Herbert & I are obliged to
be in town much of the time
The rest are enjoying themselves
