

PSILOPUS BREVIROSTRIS, Gould.

Psil. rostro perbrevi, pallidè fuscō; strigā superciliari flavescente; vertice fuscescenti-cinereo; nuchā olivaceā; dorso, uropygio, tetricibusque caudē olivaceis; plumis auricularibus, genisque pallidè rufo-brunneis; gulā, pectoreque albī, olivaceo lavatis, strigisque fuscis longitudinalibus, leviter ornatis; abdomine pallide citrino; rectricibus caudē intermediis duabus fuscis; reliquis ad basin fuscis dein nigrescente fasciatīs, et internē albo notatis, apicibus pallidè fuscis; pedibus nigrescentibus.

Long. tot. $3\frac{1}{2}$ unc.; rostri, $\frac{3}{8}$; alae, 2; caudae, $1\frac{1}{2}$; tarsi, $\frac{1}{2}$.

Bill extremely short and of a light brown; a narrow stripe of yellowish white passes from the bill over each eye; crown of the head brownish grey, passing into olive at the back of the neck; back, rump, and upper tail-coverts olive, brightest on the latter; ear-coverts and sides of the face very pale reddish brown; throat and chest white tinged with olive, with a faint longitudinal mark of brown down the centre of each feather, the remainder of the under surface pale citron yellow; two centre tail-feathers brown; the remainder brown at the base, the middle being crossed by a broad band of blackish brown, which is succeeded by a spot of white on the inner webs, the tips pale brown; feet blackish brown.

Habitat. Australia: locality, New South Wales.

PSILOPUS FUSCUS, Gould.

Psil. vertice, corporeque toto supernē, saturatē fuscis, leviter olivaceo tinctis; rectricibus caudē duabus intermediis fuscis; reliquis ad basin albī, dein nigrescenti-fusco latē fasciatīs, exindē albo notatis, apicibus pallidè fuscis; gulā, pectoreque cinereis; abdomen, crisoque albī; rostro pedibusque intēscis.

Long. tot. $3\frac{3}{4}$ unc.; rostri, $\frac{1}{2}$; alae, $2\frac{1}{4}$; caudae, $1\frac{3}{4}$; tarsi, $\frac{3}{4}$.

Crown of the head, all the upper surface, and wings dark fuscous brown, slightly tinged with olive; two centre tail-feathers brown; the remainder white at the base, succeeded by a broad band of deep blackish brown, round which is a broad stripe of white, which entirely crosses the outer feathers, but only the inner webs of the remainder, the tips pale brown; throat and chest grey; abdomen and under tail-coverts white; bill and feet deep blackish brown.

Habitat. Australia: locality, uncertain.

PSILOPUS OLIVACEUS, Gould.

Psil. strigā superciliari a basi mandibulae flavā; vertice, corporeque suprà olivaceis; alis fuscis, plumis extus olivaceo marginatis; rectricibus caudē duabus intermediis fuscis; reliquis ad basin fuscis, dein albo, nigrescenti-fusco, iterūmque albo fasciatīs, apicibus fuscis; rostro pedibusque fuscis.

Long. tot. $4\frac{1}{4}$ unc.; rostri, $\frac{1}{2}$; alae, $2\frac{1}{8}$; caudae, $1\frac{5}{8}$; tarsi, $\frac{5}{8}$.

From the base of the upper mandible over each eye a line of yellow; crown of the head and all the upper surface olive green; wings brown, externally margined with olive green; two centre tail-feathers brown, the remainder brown at the base, succeeded by a bar of white, beyond which is a broader one of dark brown; to this succeeds another of white, the extremities being brown; bill and feet brown.

SYN. *Psilopus olivaceus*, Gould in Proc. Zool. Soc., Part V., 1837.

Habitat. Australia: locality, New South Wales.

PSILOPUS ALBOGULARIS, Gould.

Psil. vertice, plumis auricularibus, corporeque suprà olivaceo-fuscis; gulā albā; pectore corporeque subtūs latē citrinis; rectricibus caudē duabus intermediis fuscis, reliquis ad basin fuscis, albo, dein latē nigrescenti-fusco fasciatīs, et internē ad apicem cervinis; rostro, pedibusque intēscis.

Long. tot. $4\frac{1}{4}$ unc.; rostri, $\frac{1}{2}$; alae, $2\frac{5}{8}$; caudae, $1\frac{3}{8}$; tarsi, $\frac{5}{8}$.

Crown of the head, ear-coverts, and all the upper surface olive brown; throat white; chest and all the under surface bright citron yellow; two centre tail-feathers brown, the remainder brown at the base, above which a bar of white, succeeded by a broader one of deep blackish brown, the tips of all but the two middle ones buffy white on their inner web; bill and feet dark brown.

SYN. *Psilopus albogularis*, Gould in Proc. Zool. Soc., Part V., 1837.

Habitat. Australia: locality, New South Wales.
