Brandegee of San Diego, he has in his garden a red pepper growing from seeds which I sent him from Acapulco it is much prized by the people for its keeping qualities and in cultivation is very ornamental and a bush near 4 feet high covered with numerous red fruit is woodsy and near 3 years old. Send you a specimen today for your herbarium, will you please determine it and send the name to Mr. Rose or myself so a copy can be sent to Mr. Brandegee.

After leaving Dr. Rose at Mazatlan to return with Mr. Nelson I went to Coquimbo Owin to the excessive rainfall could not do much ^{and} because of frequent attacks of fever the doctor strongly advising me to leave which I did in August for Topolobampo Sinaloa had improvement in health some but all together will not have

Three hundred species - so will not have sufficient to pay Cost

I am mindful of the uniform generosity extended to me not only by yourself but by your predecessors - which fact make me reluctant to ask more of you - But several parties desire a list of all the plants in their sets from Acapulco and Durango. If you could send me a list of the plants if only generally from these two localities - then I could sell the sets on hand and square up my accounts. There is one other reason why I desire the lists. Some friends have suggested that I make a collection in the most desirable parts of Chile and stay two or more years - what do you think of that suggestion. I fear my strength is not sufficient unless the climate helps me.

Personally Paraguay would be my selection as with the government exception of 1857 to that country my first plants was collected but Bonpland has been there - If we consider Peru in connection with many of our Western States it may be good.
