I have just returned from Victoria Tamaulipas Mexico One of the most difficult places I ever collected <sup>in</sup> its not only very mountainous but you have to live so far from the mountains there being no dwellings you could stop at in the mountains and a conveyance suitable to reach the working ground cost one dollar per hour Mexican money your conveyance wait while you go and hunt until you are tired out and return to your Hotel to care for your treasures (camping not safe) nevertheless I have some 500 entries mostly trees and woody plants among which are many novelties. Can I have the pleasure of sending you a set of plants from this intertropical region at the usual terms. I visited Gomez-Trariaz a village some distance by Rail Road from Victoria and where the vegetation was somewhat different.
