HOLOTYPE DEPOSITION OF *HENICOMYIA BICOLOR*

The holotype of *Henicomysia bicolor* Lyneborg [♂ specimen, number 1212, Brazil, Nova Teutonia, 27°11'S, 52°23'W, xi-1944, Fritz Plaumann] was mistakenly deposited in the United States National Museum of Natural History [In Lyneborg, L. 1972. A revision of the *Xestomyza*-group of Therevidae (Diptera). Ann. Natal Mus. 21(2):368]. The specimen was borrowed by me from the Canadian National Collection and subsequently loaned to Lyneborg for inclusion in his monograph on the *Xestomyza*-group of Therevidae. The holotype of *Henicomysia bicolor* Lyneborg has now been redeposited in the Canadian National Collection, Ottawa, Ontario, Canada.
