Dear Mr. Wilson

Mr. Reichenbach now sends atoms
of his common sunbeam of Dallas County;
his bush is *G. San Sabine* Buckley and is
a scaly form of *G. Durandi* Rich Buckley
and Sargent got at Austin and I took
at the old, much dabbled Buckley on locality
in Alabama! *G. Durandi* is to be the name
and the species is good.

But that is not what I wanted to
talk about. Reichenbach sends two Umbellifer
which, he says, you and Gray have both
pronounced to be *Apicia Popei*. But they
are certainly distinct.

A. Popei according to the original description
in Gray's Report has large fruit, rough on
the edges; leafy involucres and involucells; the
umbells are terminal, though that is not mentioned
in the article. This is more usually erect.

The other is a plant which years ago I sent
to Dr. Gray as *A. Bitteri* from Dak Territory;
I have it also from Master Gray, and now from
Reichenbach; Gray then pronounced it *A. Popei*,
but it is quite distinct: prostrate or so, with
radiflorous or rather opposite flowers in umbells,
small, nearly smooth fruit. What Hall's plant
no involucres or involucells.

is, I do not know, for I have no specimen.

Now, this is an undescribed species, entirely distinct from Poppi; as nodiflorum is already preoccupied, it might be called *Poppi lateriflorum*.

Now look at your *A. Poppi* and see whether you do not find both species mixed under that name.

I send a package today to Dr Gray with a few interesting things.
