My dear Gray

Your letter was on my table
when I came in from New yesterday
and I hasten to thank you for all your
kind wishes and return you our best
wishes to yourself and Mr. Gray that you
may enjoy health and prosperity
throughout the new year As to the
main purport of yours letter I can only
answer positively on Saturday as New is
clouded for the holiday today and tomorrow
but upon reading over your character
of the genus it struck me at once that
the tubular perianth bearing the
stamnodes and especially the structure
of the seed threw the plant at one far
away both from Hydrocharidæ and
Naiadæ and thus I need not enter into
the most points of how far these two

orders are to be distanced from each other It strikes me that your plant must be a *Boutelouea* very near *Septantius* - but I will look into it on Saturday

New Saturday - Your plant must be very close upon *Heteranthera* (*Septantius* Mich.) *graminea* & therefore return you the specimen for reconsideration as you must be well acquainted with this *H. graminea* and perhaps did not recognise it in an imperfect specimen
