

Cambridge. 18^r. Feby. 1857.

Dear Mr. Wright.

In my last, sent 8 or 10 days ago, I told you what I meant to send you paper ss. - by the Bark R.M. Walsh which is up for Galveston - to sail on the 26th -

I have made arrangements so to do, & send on board to-morrow addressed simply "Bhas' Wright, Galveston, Texas."

4 bundles containing 15 Reams of paper - as per enclosed bill. - with 2 pieces strong wrapping paper & 8 pieces binders board - the packages well wrapped in Manilla paper, after being protected with the boards - which will serve for pres. boards - I have chosen good paper, for dries. & I mean them for delicate plants - also for holding plants when dried - This is more than you asked for - If you want more it can be sent next time - I have said it wrapped in such a way that no injury can well occur in the voyage - or on wagons to Boston. Please have it ready for at Galveston.

Also I send with the bundle a bag - addressed like the rest. containing - your manuscript.

a copy of Pl. Faust. of Webster's Thomson's
I Dana's Abridged Mineralogy which I happened to
have. - Glendoffs Spanish Grammar & Miller's
Elementary English (\$ 2.87). 2 good magnifying glasses
(\$ 1.00), one knife with saw - the only one I could
find (\$ 1.00) 2 yards India Rubber Cloth (\$ 1.50) & one
large India Rubber Camp Blanket, cotton flannel inside.
Large \$ 3.87.

I hope you will think I have done
pretty well, considering. Since I began to make
preparations my wife's cousin has been very sick
in the house, where her wife now lies.

On Saturday I got your favor of Jan 9. - - -
enclosed in Mr. Mc Blues - of 17 Jan. from Webster.

I wrote to-night to New York to have the books &
asked for Standard & Safety mail to him &
will charge the amount to you. Hope they
will reach safely. I could not get them
here, or I would have sent by N.Y.P. -

I have not yet had time to open the
3 remaining packages of your collection, - hope to
do so soon. I have engaged a young man to
come over fr. New York to help me distribute them
into sets. Etc.

As soon as Mr. L. W. Laramore is printed M. Hall

said you a copy.

I still wait anxiously to hear your
plan for next campaign - I do not bear from
Prof. Gray yet. He could send you letter if he knew
what region you will visit explore it - Do tell
us. My opinion is that I could do little in
settling purely Mexican Plants. The proper region
now is between El Paso & California & the Great
interior Basin. There will doubtless be explorations
the coming year between New Mexico & Mormontown
& that is a route of high promise -
