My dear Dr. Powell:

You asked me to send to you any observations I made as I worked through your specimens. TOday I have been busy with Polystachya as represented in Central America and the West Indies. Your 122 referred to P. panamensis Schltr. ined., is painfully close to P. minor Fawe. & Rendle. a Jamaican species which also reaches British Guiana, according to its authors, and is a native of Mexico and Panama according to my observations. I do not see on what characters Dr. S. separates his species based on your 122 from P. minor. Furthermore he has recently published a new species under the name P. guatemalensis comparing it with P. minor. If you do not happen to have material of P. minor, I will send you a few flowers and the original description of the species.

You may be sure that I am counting the days in anticipation of another package of your valued material.
